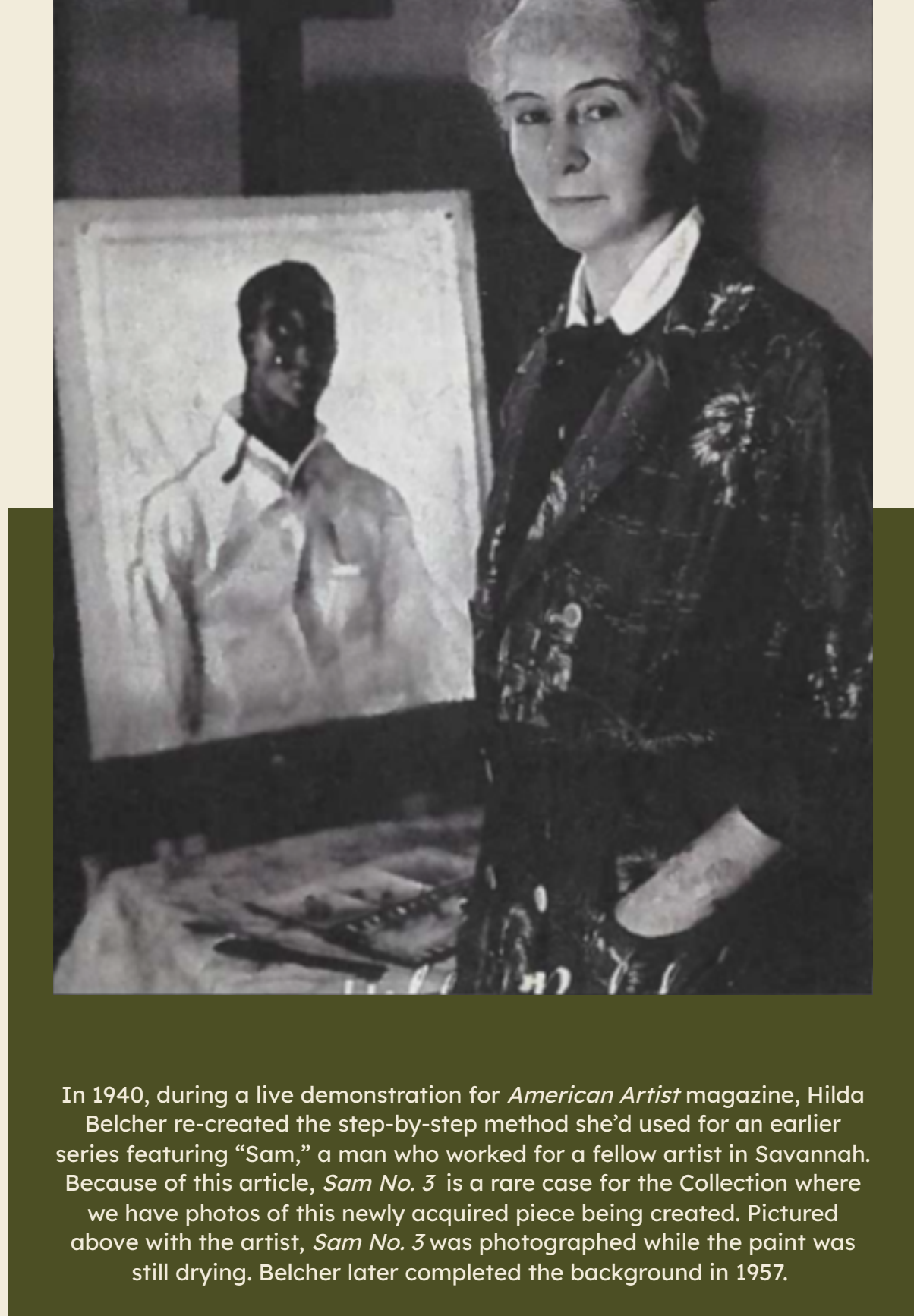

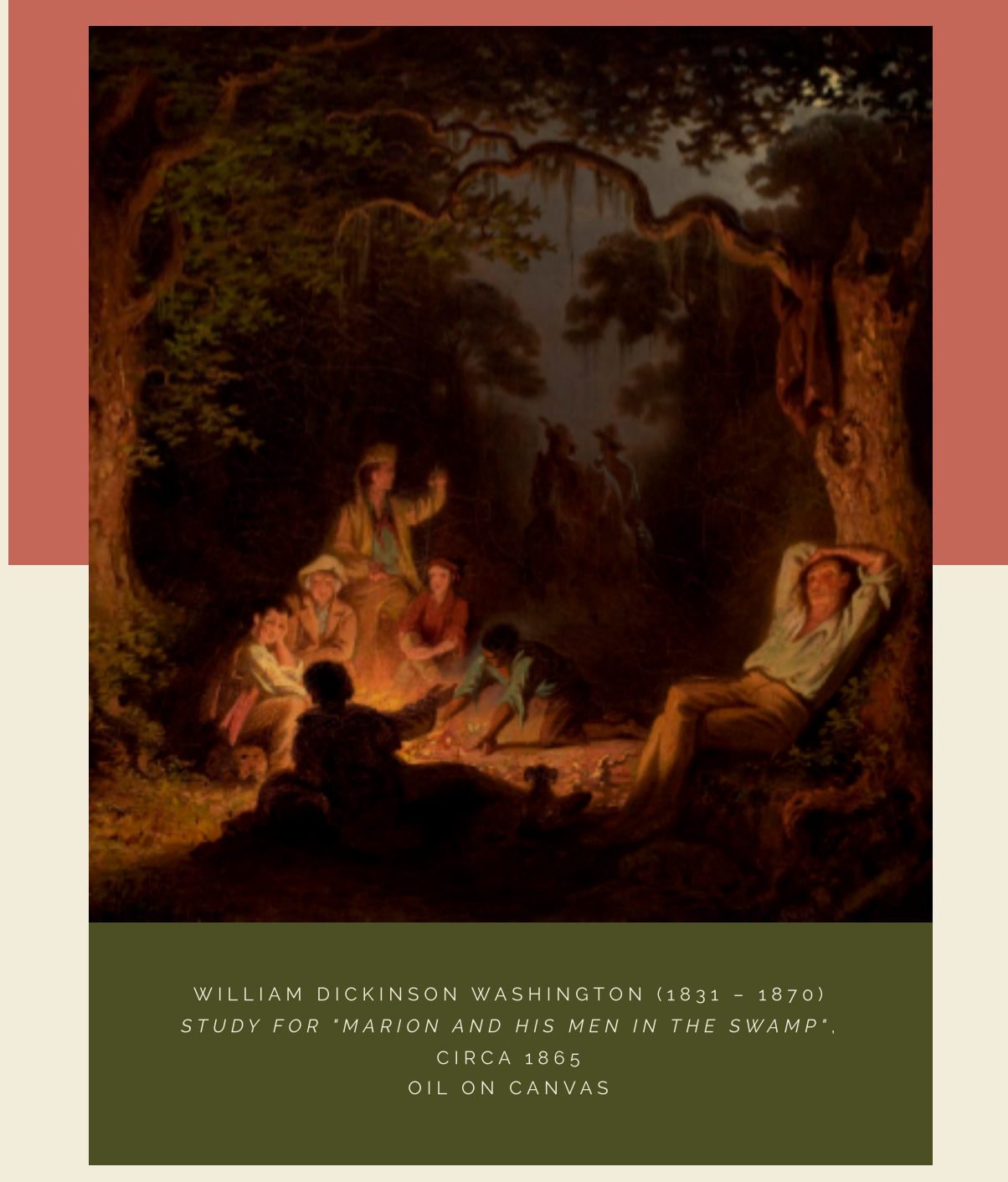
NEW ACQUISITION ALERT

Hilda Belcher (1881 – 1965) • *Sam No. 3* • 1940/1957 • Watercolor on paper



In 1940, during a live demonstration for *American Artist* magazine, Hilda Belcher re-created the step-by-step method she'd used for an earlier series featuring "Sam," a man who worked for a fellow artist in Savannah. Because of this article, *Sam No. 3* is a rare case for the collection where we have photos of this newly acquired piece being created. Pictured above with the artist, *Sam No. 3* was photographed while the paint was still drying. Belcher later completed the background in 1957.

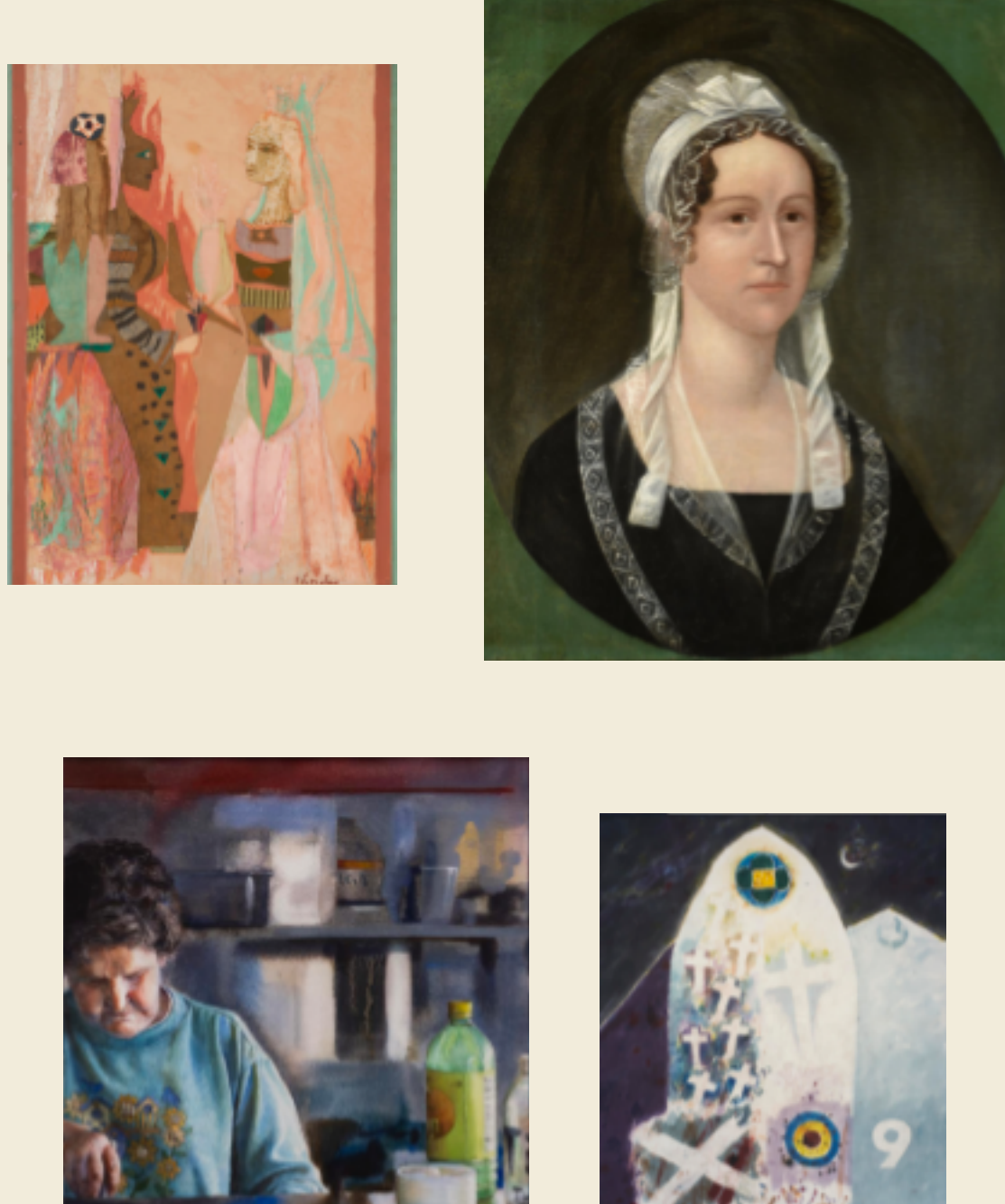
Happy 250th USA!

General Francis Marion, nicknamed the "Swamp Fox," became a legendary figure of the American Revolution (1775-1783) for his daring guerrilla campaigns against British forces in the South Carolina Lowcountry. Operating from hidden forest camps, Marion and his small band of soldiers struck swiftly and disappeared into the swamps, embodying the resourcefulness and resilience that came to symbolize the patriot cause.

In this study for *Marion and His Men*, William Dickinson Washington dramatizes one such encampment, capturing a moment of quiet camaraderie amid the hardships of war. Moonlight filters through the moss-draped trees, illuminating Marion and his troops as they rest by the fire. Painted during the Civil War, Washington's romantic depiction of Revolutionary heroism resonated with nineteenth-century Southerners seeking historical models of courage and independence rooted in their regional landscape and identity.

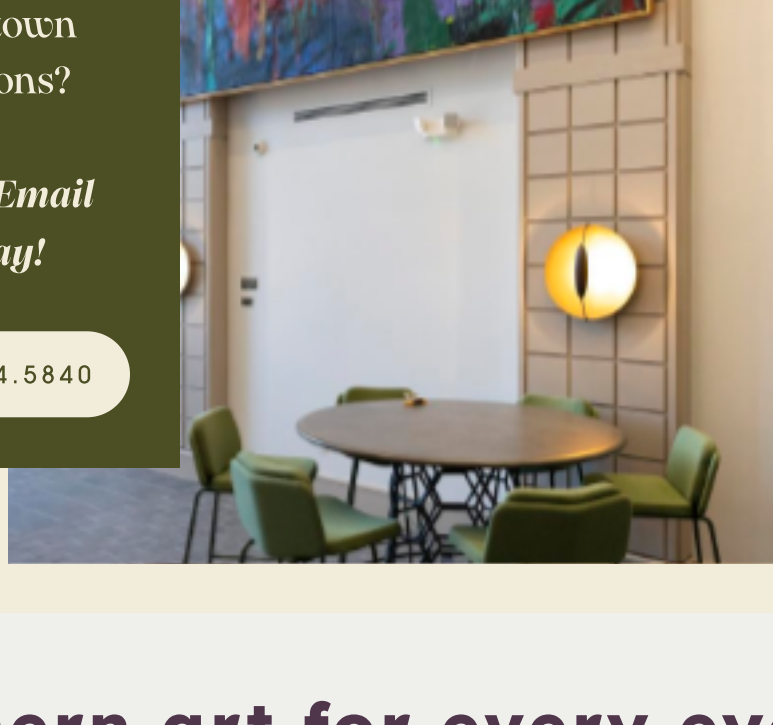

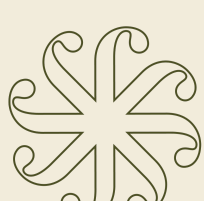
